



# Anoping Aventurero CAMPING AVENTURERO

The meaning of the word **HATUN**: The word HATUN comes from the Kichwa language and means "**great**". It is always connected to the great that is **mother nature**, or in our case, to the great that is the Amazon rainforest or the different cultures that are immersed in nature. In the same way the meaning of "large" in the news can also mean "fragile" because of the fact that this great wealth called the Amazonian rainforest is increasingly threatened by pollution, the exploitation of our natural resources, climate change and many other factors.

### HATUN PROGRAMS

HATUN offers various adventure camping activities in different locations in the Amazon rainforest.

### YASUNÍ Adventure Camping Program 4 days/3 nights

Location: Province of Orellana (Coca), Community of Pilchi.

**Meeting point:** the town of Coca. On recommendation, you arrive a day before the trip to the city of Coca so as not to be tired during the tour.

**Arrival point:** Community of Pilche.

Day 1: Departure at 7:30 a.m. by motorized canoe along the Napo River until reaching the community of Pilche, approximate travel time of two and a half hours. Once you arrive at the community, you will take a break and visit the Kichwa community. later settle down for lunch at 1:00 p.m., then from 4:00 p.m. the tour continues to reach the sleeping point at the campsite where there is a walk to the Mandi River, then take rowing canoes down to the lagoon from mandi, the approximate journey between trekking and canoeing is 2.5 hours until you arrive at the campsite, then you will settle in the tents, evening dinner, after dinner depending on the mood, any activity in the jungle, it can be a night time visit to the lagoon to observe alligators.

Day 2: Breakfast at 8:00 a.m. Then departure for a long and quiet walk to observe and enjoy the jungle, walk for approximately 3 to 4 hours then lunch at noon in the afternoon after lunch a break to then go fishing for piranhas from 4:00 p.m. and dinner in the evening.

Day 3: This day you get up at 05:00 to wake up the jungle, in addition to sharing the traditional wayusa drink, the tour of about 2-3 hours through the lagoon and the river to be able to observe some species of the day, on the way back. of the tour you have breakfast from 8:00 a.m. then a break is taken and lunch will be taken at 1:00 p.m., in the afternoon after lunch the observation tower activity will be carried out to enjoy the panorama and observation of various species of birds, dinner in the evening, evening walk or night navigation, this will be done after dinner.

Day 4: Breakfast is taken at 8:00 a.m., luggage is organized to return to the community with a walk and a motor canoe, upon arrival at the community around 11:00 a.m. one last activity will be carried out, visiting a family for a surprise tasting, then From midday we will wait for the canoe to return to the town of Coca where the jungle tour ends and they can take their respective destinations.

#### Activities that are waiting for you:

- Explanations on medicinal plants.
- Swimming in the lagoon.
- Night walk in the jungle
- Piraña fishing
- Visit a Kichwa family

#### Price:

- 1 person: \$400 4 days/3 nights
- 2 people: \$285 per person / 4 days / 3 nights
- From 3 to 8 people (max): \$235 per person / 4 days 3 nights
- Child or teenager: \$190

**Important note:** the food is basic, the price does not include return public transport tickets Quito-Coca, it is necessary to bring special medicines if you have a particular illness or allergy and activities may vary depending on the weather, that is, they can be adapted according to the visitor's taste.

#### What you should take into the jungle:

- Original personal documents, such as passports.
- Headlamp.
- Sunscreen, hat, mosquito repellent.
- Light, long clothes, enough socks.
- personal hygiene things
- Swimsuit.
- Recharged camera batteries (go-pro if they have them)
- Appropriate medications if you have a specific illness or allergy.
- Sandals.
- Raincoat.


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
